#### **Hi Beanstalks!**

If you want to print out the Bean Pod\* to look like a book:

- 1. Print out the pages (you might check the "reverse order" box when you print so the end product is a pile of spreads in the right order, with the cover on top, and the Calendar page right under it. Otherwise you'll have to put the pages in order yourself.
- 2. Then take the cover page, place it face down on the table and put the stack (with the Calendar page being on top) on top of the faced-down cover page.
- 3. Staple in the corner, and fold in half like a booklet, and you'll have the closest thing you can get to a booklet without using a saddle stitcher!
- \*If you want to save your color ink, you can print it in black and white.
