Hi Beanstalks!

If you want to print out the Bean Pod* to look like a book:

- 1. Print out the pages (you might check the "reverse order" box when you print so the end product is a pile of spreads in the right order, with the cover on top, and the Calendar page right under it. Otherwise you'll have to put the pages in order yourself.
- 2. Then take the cover page, place it face down on the table and put the stack (with the Calendar page being on top) on top of the faced-down cover page.
- 3. Staple in the corner, and fold in half like a booklet, and you'll have the closest thing you can get to a booklet without using a saddle stitcher!
- *If you want to save your color ink, you can print it in black and white.

REMEMBERING OUR FRIEND, SANDY ALLEN

The World's Tallest Woman dies at 53. Shelbyville, Indiana, native Sandy Allen used her 7-foot 7-inch height to teach kids that it's OK to be different.

The woman who grew to be 7 feet, 7-1/4 inches tall and was recognized as the world's tallest female, died early August. She was 53. Sandy Allen used her height to inspire schoolchildren to accept those who are different. She died at the Heritage House Convalescent Center in her hometown of Shelbyville, Ind., family friend Rita Rose said. The cause of death was not yet known. Allen had been hospitalized in recent months as she suffered from a recurring blood infection, along with diabetes, breathing troubles, and kidney failure.

In London, Guinness World Records spokesman Damian Field confirmed Wednesday that Allen was still listed as the tallest woman. Some Web sites cite a 7-foot-9 woman from China. Coincidentally, Allen lived in the same nursing home as 115-year-old Edna Parker, whom Guinness has recognized as the world's oldest person since August, 2007.

Allen said a tumor caused her pituitary gland to produce too much growth hormone. She underwent an operation in

1977 to stop further growth. But, she was proud of her height, Rose said. "She embraced it. She used it as a tool to educate people."

Allen appeared on television shows, and spoke to church and school groups, to bring youngsters her message that it was all right to be different. In 2007, ABC's Primetime interviewed her and a woman who only stands 4'9". They compared similar experiences in fitting into a house built for 'normal' people.

Allen weighed 6-1/2 pounds when she was born in June 1955. By the age of 10 she had grown to be 6-foot-3, and by age 16 she was 7-1. She played basketball (Indiana = basketball), in high school, but said you have to have an aggressive personality to excel at it. She wrote to Guinness World Records in 1974, saying she would like to get to know someone her own height. "It is needless to say my social life is practically nil and perhaps the publicity from your book may brighten my life," she wrote.





The recognition as the World's Tallest Woman helped Allen accept her height and become less shy, Rose said. "It kind of brought her out of her shell." Rose said. "She got to the point where she could joke about it." In the 1980s, she appeared for several years at the Guinness Museum of World Records in Niagara Falls. Ontario. "I'll never forget the old Japanese man who couldn't speak English, so he decided to feel for himself if I was real," she recalled with a chuckle. "At Guinness there were days when I felt like I was doing a freak show," she said. "When that feeling came too often, I knew I had to come back home." She moved back to Indiana in 1987.

Difficulty with mobility had forced Allen to curtail her public speaking in recent years, Rose said. She had suffered from diabetes and other ailments, and used a wheelchair to get around. Rose is working to set up a scholarship fund in Allen's name, with proceeds going to Shelbyville High School. "She loved talking to kids because they would ask more honest questions," Rose said. "Adults would kind of stand back and stare, and not know how to approach her."

In 1999, she attended the Convention of

Tall Clubs International in Pittsburgh, PA. TCI is a social club for men and women of outstanding height – 6'2" for men, and 5'10" for women, in stocking feet. Sandy wasn't required to measure in. She was invited to be a judge in the Miss Tall International® Pageant at the Convention. During one side trip, to Sharon, PA, two stores offered her clothing and shoes that fit. She said it was the 1st time since she was 12 that she had had on a pair of pumps: size 24. She said she had known about TCI for several years, but never contacted the group because she was concerned that we would just try to use her for advertising. After a week, that changed: "I don't believe you guys. You're treating me as if I were normal." She was a guest at weekend parties hosted by TCI Clubs in Cincinnati, Chicago, and Las

Sandy Allen's family, friends, and neighbors said goodbye on Monday, August 18, in Shelbvville. IN.

Several hundred gathered to remember her; she left messages for us. She was a deeply religious woman, who reminded us that God loves each of us more than we can imagine.

A number of friends recalled how she dealt with being tall at one time or another. One of her greatest pleasures was going to schools, to talk to small children about accepting someone who is different that they. At the High Cincinnatians Tall Club weekend several years ago, Sandy sat in the hotel atrium, talking to everyone. A 3-year old marched up and hopped up in Sandy's lap. Her 5-year old sister was shy, and hid behind her mother. Sandy coaxed her to 'give me 5'. Finally, the girl held out her doll. Sandy tapped it on the head and both laughed.

From the Town and Country Christian Center, the group followed the hearse to the center of town. At the traffic circle, her casket was moved from the car to a horse drawn wagon. Along the way, neighbors held up hand drawn signs that said, "God Bless," or, "Goodbye." I guess there were 2-300 people standing in the center of town, waiting for her final drive through.

In a letter read at the close of the funeral, Sandy answered the proverbial question: "The weather's fine up here."

Come for an early fall walk at scenic Wachusett Reservoir. The walk may also include members of the Brookline Bird Club. But you don't have to be a bird expert! Come for the turning leaves, birds of prey, fresh, cool air, and just for the health of it. Bring binoculars if you have them, and wear comfortable walking shoes, sneakers, or hiking boots.

According to the Dept. of Conservation and Recreation, in 1897 the Nashua River was dammed by the Wachusett Dam in Clinton, MA, thus starting the beginning stages of the Wachusett Reservoir. The granite dam spans 971 feet and rises some 114 feet above the ground. It remains the largest hand-built dam in the world. Building the reservoir involved only horses, mules and


simple mechanical devices, such as pulleys and levers. Steam was the only source of power. Located along Route 70 in Clinton, it is indeed an amazing site. The reservoir, filled by 1908, flooded sections of Boylston, Clinton, Sterling, and West Boylston. (But not Joan's house!)


Social Policies
