Hi Beanstalks!

If you want to print out the Bean Pod* to look like a book:

- 1. Print out the pages (you might check the "reverse order" box when you print so the end product is a pile of spreads in the right order, with the cover on top, and the Calendar page right under it. Otherwise you'll have to put the pages in order yourself.
- 2. Then take the cover page, place it face down on the table and put the stack (with the Calendar page being on top) on top of the faced-down cover page.
- 3. Staple in the corner, and fold in half like a booklet, and you'll have the closest thing you can get to a booklet without using a saddle stitcher!
- *If you want to save your color ink, you can print it in black and white.

OFFICER'S REPORTS:

PRESIDENT: Nothing new to report at this time.

VICE PRESIDENT: Kay Helberg was not present, but it was reported that NEATO had no problems or conflicts about the tentative dates for our Anniversary Dance in January 2009. Since only one member expressed interest in participating in the pageant (and two or three contestants were needed to make it worthwhile), there will be no pageant this year. Kay spoke with the Natick Crowne Plaza and they are willing to honor their prior contract with us. There was a general discussion about food and beverage options as well as music.

BBTC Treasurer's Report

Total Bank Balance

As at 10/31/2008: \$5083.41

General Account / Cash Flow situation

Current balance is \$1134.26.

We have received a significant amount of dues renewals thru June 2009, and a few thru June 2010.

We had to write off the \$100 deposit for Miss Tall Boston at TCI Convention 2008 due to not cancelling with sufficient notice. It would appear that the cancellation notice period was not well advertised by TCI Convention – we MUST pay attention to this in future and ASK re: cancellation policy if it is not explicitly stated. *In future, we must make sure to cancel with sufficient notice in order to avoid this waste of BBTC funds.*

There has been some use of PayPal by members when remitting dues and / or weekend package payments. This does offer some convenience to both members and BBTC administrators, but it does come with a cost / fees, which we need to work into our budget in general and / or specific event budgets.

For now, all PayPal fees are being financed out of the General Account, i.e. Weekend / Dance events are not including PayPal fees in their event budgets.

Royalty Account

Current balance is \$0.

Dance Account

Current balance is \$0. The \$500 deposit funds are reserved

being loaned to the Weekend 2008 account to cover their advance deposits/expenses which have totaled over \$2500.

Scholarship Fund

Current balance is \$480.00. One scholarship for 2007/2008 (\$500) was awarded. Only \$20 in additional fund-raising / donation is required to meet the \$500 target for 2009.

Anniversary Dance 2008

Current balance is \$700. This is the event deposit fund which is to be rolled from one year to the next, and also to be made available as loan funds to other events (e.g. Weekend).

We need to seriously consider what level/scope of event we will host in January 2009, particularly with respect to realistic attendance levels, since we would most likely have to subsidize the 2009 event, and we do not have the funds available to subsidize the event to the extent we did in 2008 (over \$1000 was spent).

Based on our experience in January 2008, it is clear that "price" / price reductions to the levels we had in 2008 make ZERO difference to attendance levels!

<u>Treasurer's recommendation:</u>

Given the ever increasing costs of hotel locations and meals, and the lackluster attendance by BBTC members at recent "key" Club events such as the Awards Party, I do not believe that we have the "legs" (in attendance numbers or subsidy funds) to host a formal hotel-based dance at a reasonable price in January 2009. We need to downscale the event to:

- "Dance only" in a more affordable (albeit less fancy) location (e.g. Church Hall, Elks Lodge), or
- Simply hold a house party with dancing (subject to a BBTC member being willing to host it at their house), or
- Go out as a group to a local restaurant / night club (e.g. Dinner and then Dancing at Vincent's Night Club)
- This is a pretty attractive option: Overhead cost is ZERO, no deposits or minimum attendance required (for Night Club), no catering effort required, no organization or booking of DJ/Band all you have to do is show up on the night, pay for whatever you fell like eating and drinking, and party/dance yourself dizzy!

Weekend 2008

Current balance is \$276.13.


