### **Hi Beanstalks!**

If you want to print out the Bean Pod\* to look like a book:

- 1. Print out the pages (you might check the "reverse order" box when you print so the end product is a pile of spreads in the right order, with the cover on top, and the Calendar page right under it. Otherwise you'll have to put the pages in order yourself.
- 2. Then take the cover page, place it face down on the table and put the stack (with the Calendar page being on top) on top of the faced-down cover page.
- 3. Staple in the corner, and fold in half like a booklet, and you'll have the closest thing you can get to a booklet without using a saddle stitcher!
- \*If you want to save your color ink, you can print it in black and white.

Meeting called to order at 7:06 p.m.

#### OFFICERS' REPORTS:

**President:** Absent. Reported that we have postponed our weekend originally scheduled for April 2010 due to a NEATO conflict. Will discuss at future meeting if we want to hold a weekend in Fall 2010 or Spring 2011. (NOTE: Kay chaired the meeting in John's absence as highest ranking board member in attendance at the start of the meeting.)

**Vice President:** Sylvia reviewed the specific details and costs of the upcoming Anniversary Dance and Pageant. It was agreed that, since we will not be having a weekend in April, we should explore a Spring dance. The site of the Autumn dance (in Waltham) was recommended for that event.



### From the North and West:

From Route 128 (I-95), take exit 20A (Route 9 East). Take 9 east about 2.5 miles. You'll go through 3 sets of lights. After the 3rd light, you'll see the Chestnut Hill Mall on your left & the Atrium Mall on your right. Continue about 1/4 mile. At Milton's and Barnes & Noble, there will be an exit to the right; take that exit, & at the bottom of the ramp turn right ("West Roxbury/Hyde Park"). This is Hammond Pond Parkway.

On Hammond Pond Parkway, proceed through a set of lights & continue for about a mile. You'll reach a large rotary. Take the 3rd exit off the rotary (both the 1st & 3rd exits are Newton St. - take the 3rd one!). After about 1/2 mile, the road splits. Take the right fork, West Roxbury Pkway.

Go over the small hill & through the light at the top of the hill; at the bottom there's a 2nd rotary. Take the 1st exit from the rotary onto Grove St. (between a small shopping area & a synagogue). Go over another small hill with a light at the top. At the bottom of the hill, there will be a 2nd light (Beverly Rd). Go through the light, at which point the street name changes to Independence Drive. Number 7 is the 1st driveway on the right (although it's very hard to see the number), about 50 feet past the light.

### From the South:

Take the Exit 15A from Route 128 (I-95) in Dedham (marked "to Route 1A") to the Providence Highway which becomes VFW Parkway (old route 1). Go 5.2 miles & turn left onto Independence Drive. (The Harvard Vanguard Medical Associates building is on the near left corner.) In  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile you'll come to the traffic light at Beverly Rd & Russet Rd. Park just before this traffic light. Number 7 is across the street on the left, the 1st driveway from the intersection.

#### From the East:

Take Rt. 9 & turn left at Hammond Street. Theres's a CVS on the far right corner of this intersection. Take the 4th exit off the rotary at the end of Hammond Street, & follow the directions from the West above.

OR take the VFW Pkway (old Rt 1) from Jamaica Plain to Independence Drive. (The Harvard Vanguard Medical Associates building is on the far right corner.) Follow the directions from the South above.


Boston College is located in the Chestnut Hill section of Newton, Massachusetts. The campus is approximately six miles west of the city of Boston.






